I have always believed if you care about someone and if someone has made a difference in your life it is important to let them know.

So I sit here thinking about Winona ORC and the companies like Fastenal, Watkins, Peerless Chain and Hal Leonard and so many others who contribute to Winona ORC. I am grateful to them all.

At Winona ORC we are not judged by our disabilities but are encouraged to use our abilities.

There is sometimes a certain stigma to places like Winona ORC. I also had some preconceived ideas that have been drastically changed since I began working there six months ago. At Winona ORC we are encouraged to do jobs we are comfortable with but never forced to do jobs that we are uncomfortable with.

The job coaches work with us to ensure that we do our work correctly and satisfactorily. I have met several new people as my coworkers and have great admiration for the jobs they do and the positive attitude they have. Some of them have severe handicaps but come to work happy and grateful to feel useful.

A year and a half ago I lost my eldest son. I didn't know that I could feel such pain. I am sixty-four, in a wheelchair and have anxiety problems so I tend to isolate even more since my son's death. Six months ago I could not handle the depression and anxiety anymore. I was at my lowest point and knew that I had to do something or I might not be able to come back from the dark and lonely place I had fallen into.

Because of my age and handicap, I wasn't exactly on the top of anyone's hiring list so I applied at Winona ORC. They hired me and since then this has turned into the most rewarding job I have ever had.

I still have to fight depression daily but I feel useful now.

I want the people at Winona ORC to know how grateful I am because they helped pull me from a dark place I didn't want to be in. The people at Winona ORC have made a difference in my life.
