Winona ORC has partnered with Wesley United Methodist Church, providing residents of Winona and the surrounding areas with a shredding event to destroy their sensitive documents. This event, held once every three months, allows individuals to bring in sensitive documents they would like shredded; which will be done at Winona ORC's secured shredding facility.

The latest event, held on March 30th, brought in a total of 2,800 pounds of confidential documents, which was shredded by the clients at Winona ORC.

The next event is scheduled for June 29th from 8 a.m. - 11 a.m. at 114 West Broadway.


The Supported Employment Employer of the Year went to Experience Works. By collaborating with Experience Works, more than 20 clients have found successful employment opportunities within our community.

The CSDS accreditation is awarded to individuals who demonstrate a

high level of understanding and competency on issues pertinent to secure data and product destruction. With this accreditation, Hostettler will be able to develop policy and procedures, manage various data disposal (including paper and electronic disposal), as well as oversee security audits. She will also be available to educate companies on the importance of compliance when it comes to documentation retention and disposal.
