COVID-19 and how it affects Winona ORC by Heidi S. Smith

What a spring 2020 has been! And while the pandemic has changed how we do many things on a day to day basis, our commitment to those we serve at Winona ORC has not changed. Let me catch you up on how Winona ORC is managing the COVID-19 pandemic.

- On March 18, 2020 the people we serve were sent home for their safety. Since that time, all the Winona ORC staff that typically work along those we serve are doing all the work themselves.
- On May 10th, 2020 all Day Service Programs were required to shut down, if they hadn't already and were instructed to wait for guidance from the Minnesota Department of Human Services to re-open.
- On May 30, 2020 this guidance was issued to Winona ORC, in which it requires to lay out the plans we need to have in place for the initial group of individuals we serve to safely return to work.
- Right now we are working hard on this plan!

One of the greatest challenges we have faced is the lack of "retainer funding" or agency revenue for our services. When the people we serve are here, we are paid through their service agreements to support them. However, since they have not been here, we have not received this funding or any other supportive funding from the State of Minnesota to preserve or retain our services for the people we serve's return. In other words, until those we serve return to Winona ORC, we are operating our business at a loss. Your support is always appreciated and during this time as we prepare for the return of those we serve, your donations are, more than ever, needed and appreciated!

We have learned a lot through this time and hope you have taken a few moments to reflect on what is important to you as well. Some of the things we have learned are:

- The people we serve everyday are SO important to Winona ORC and we never knew how much we would miss them!
- Hugs and friends are really important.
- We have amazing customers and advocates in our Winona Community.
- We are stronger together than we are apart!

Our current slogan is: "The Mission is to Return to the Mission." And our mission is "to provide services for people with disabilities in our community, including: vocational counseling, comprehensive job-related skill training and meaningful employment." We look forward to returning to our mission and we thank you for your continued support!
