Those two ladies taught me more about life than any college course I ever took on human behavior. They shared their hearts with me, their meals, and their fears and how they had been bullied, ridiculed and marginalized because they were different. After one week of working with them, I knew I had found my calling.

Many people I know work to make money, gain prestige or just work to work. I have been blessed: I found what I was meant to do.
