On April 2, 2019, a delegation from Ukraine came to Winona ORC to learn about how to help serve individuals with disabilities. In addition to touring Winona ORC's laundry and production floor, they sat through several trainings from community members.

Christy Ferrington from HVMHC (Hiawatha Valley Mental Health Center) discussed Mental Health Services in Winona. Craig Porter from Plasticert discussed hiring people with disabilities in the competitive workforce. Ruth Charles discussed ACES (Adverse Childhood Experiences) and the impact they have on children. Margaret Schild discussed Special Education and Continuing Education in the Winona community.

We all shared a "Potluck" for lunch, which was a new idea for our Ukrainian visitors. They enjoyed several hot dishes, Swedish meatballs, and other local favorites. Several commented on the idea that there is nothing like Winona ORC in Ukraine. Most individuals with disabilities are separated at orphanages and do not get the opportunity to participate in their community until they are in their late 30's. We definitely showed how wonderful it is to have the people we serve working alongside us and living as neighbors in the community!

They visited other locations in Winona, such as HCO (Home and Community Options), Habitat for Humanity, and Project FINE throughout their week-long visit.

The Ukrainian delegation visited for the week through the Open World program (<u>https://www.openworld.gov/</u>). Rotary of Winona hosted the delegates for the week and Max Vatmin stayed with Heidi Smith, Executive Director of Winona ORC.
