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It has been almost a year now that Watkins has set up a special room at the Watkins Plant for our WORC crew to diligently do random spice and packing jobs. These jobs include hand filling various bath salts, dips, seasoning, bay leaves, salves and more. The room has been totally refurbished with new painted floors, walls, and ceilings. It is divided into two rooms, one a controlled room for hand filling the spices and seasonings, the other adjoining room is set up for packaging lotions and salves and anything else that shows up.



Our site is under the watchful eye of June Sylvester, our primary coach, and followed up with several other coaches, Jacob Grippen, Heather Johnson, Cord Van Winkle to name a few. Depending on what is being done and in what room depends on the amount of clients working at the site. The amount of employees needed can be anywhere from 4 to 8 or more at times. The site does involve possibly working both rooms at the same time which becomes a challenge for our coaches and crew.

Winona Laundry Adds Two More Customers

We are happy to announce that Saint Anne of Winona along with Good Shepherd Lutheran Services of Rushford have joined Winona Laundry. Work began on the culinary linens for Saint Anne's on September 1st of 2016. Good Shepherd started service with Winona Laundry one month later on October 1st of 2016, outsourcing a few linen items to supplement their existing work force. The new work is a great fit for Winona Laundry providing additional volume and meaningful work for our employees. The addition of Saint Anne of Winona and Good Shepherd Lutheran Services puts Winona Laundry at an estimated 80% of current equipment capacity.



The Winona community is so generous and Winona Laundry would not be here without that generosity. What goes unnoticed much of the time is the willingness of local businesses to form business relationships with Winona ORC. Without these relationships there would be no meaningful work for our employees.
